

WHAT WE BELIEVE

I. God is Good and Jesus is Perfect Theology

God's goodness is not unknowable or uncertain. God is a good father, who gives good gifts to His children. We maintain that God seeks to display extravagant love for people in every situation. Jesus is the ultimate representation of the Father and Holy Spirit. His actions and words depict the heart of God with complete authority.
